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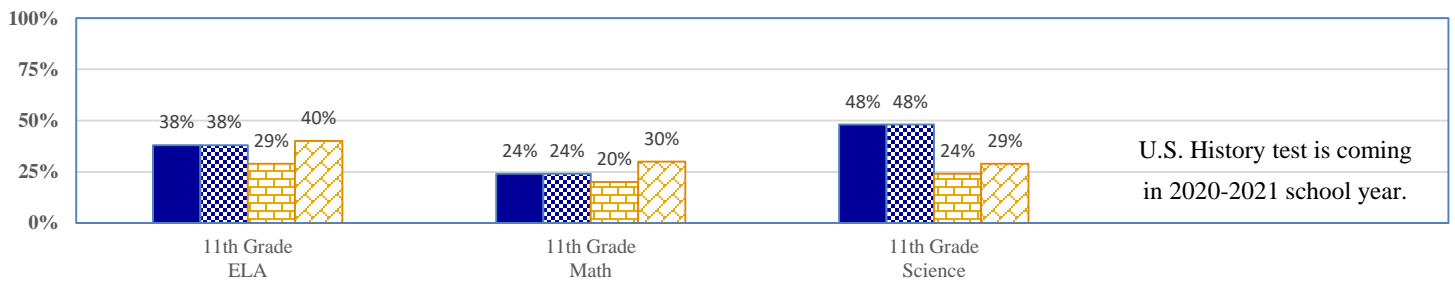

U.S. History test is coming in 2020-2021 school year.

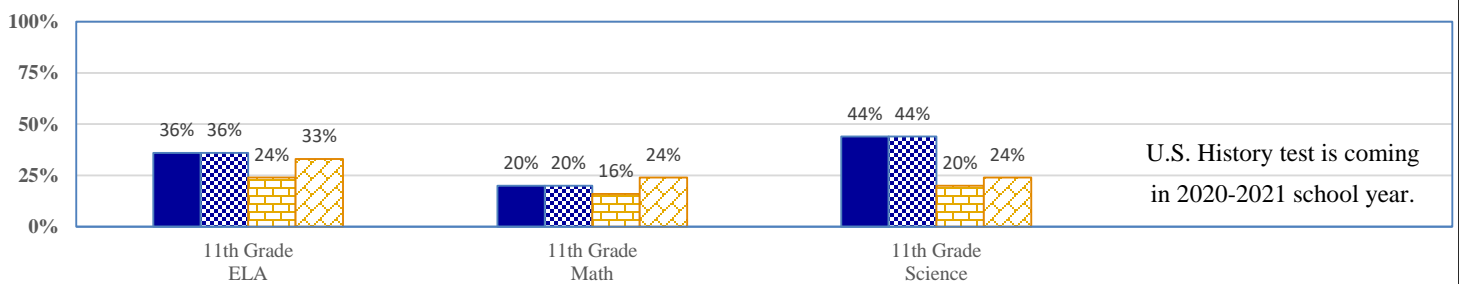
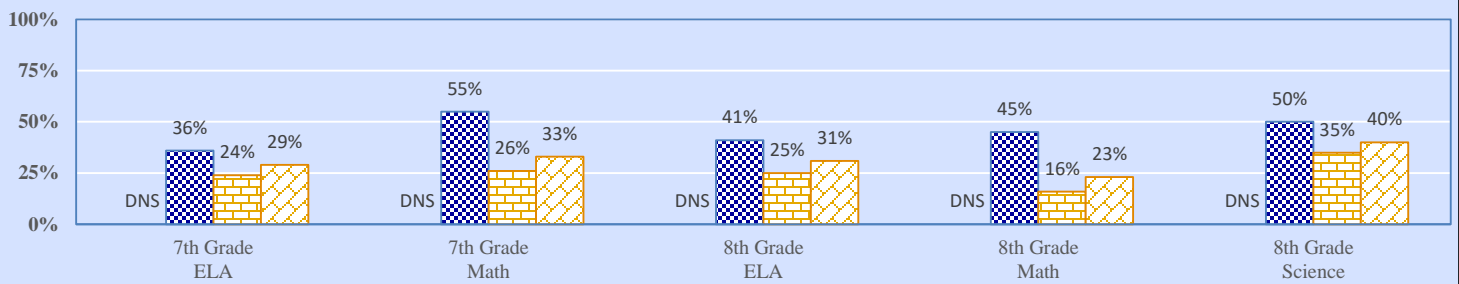
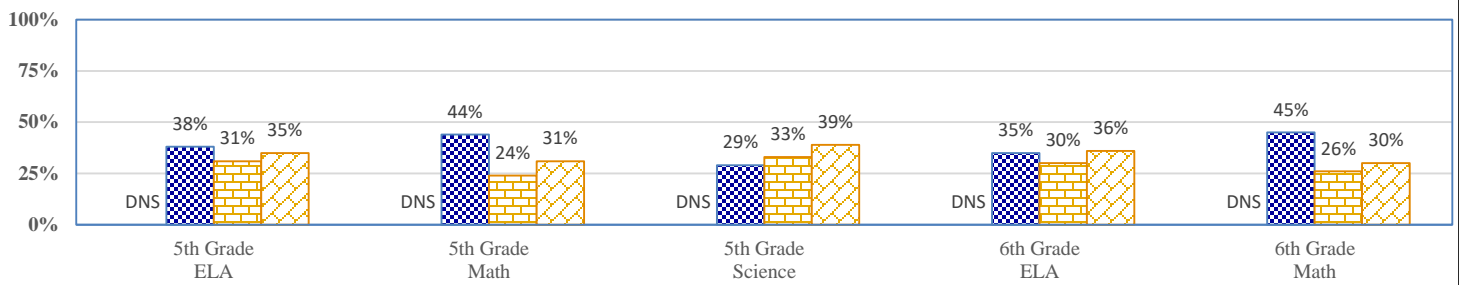
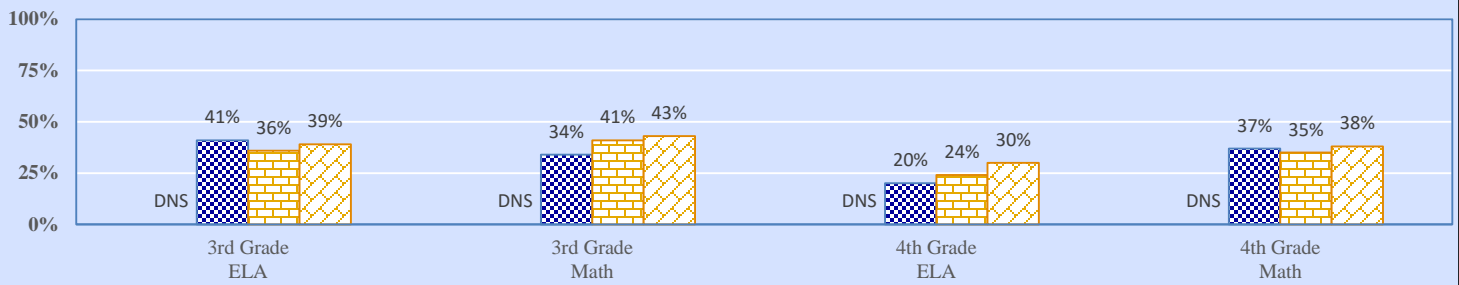
