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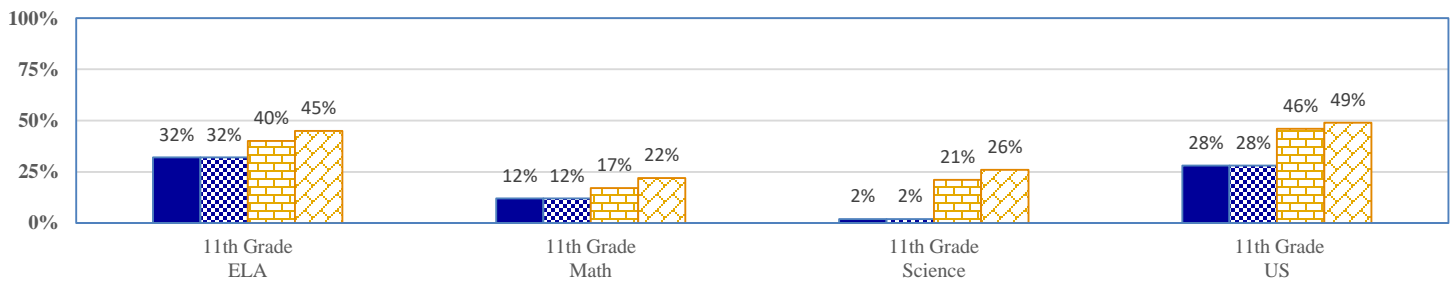

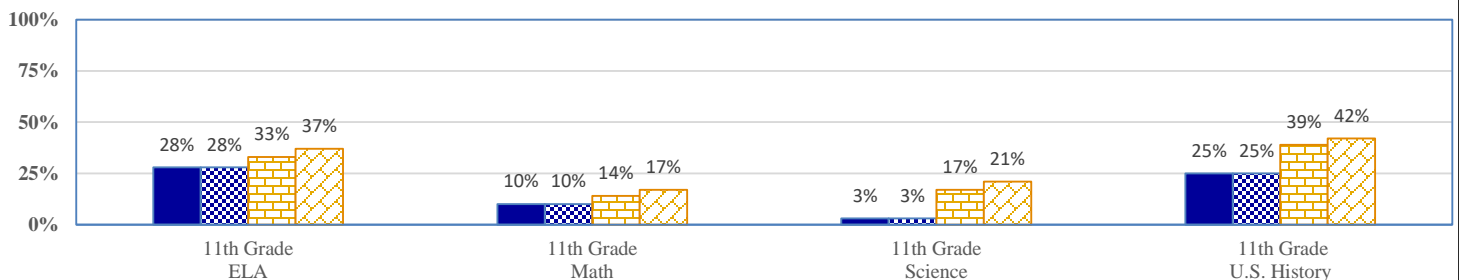
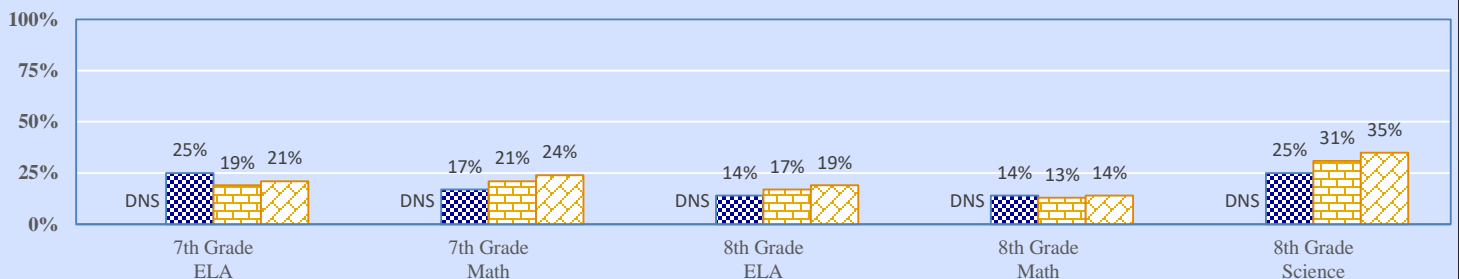
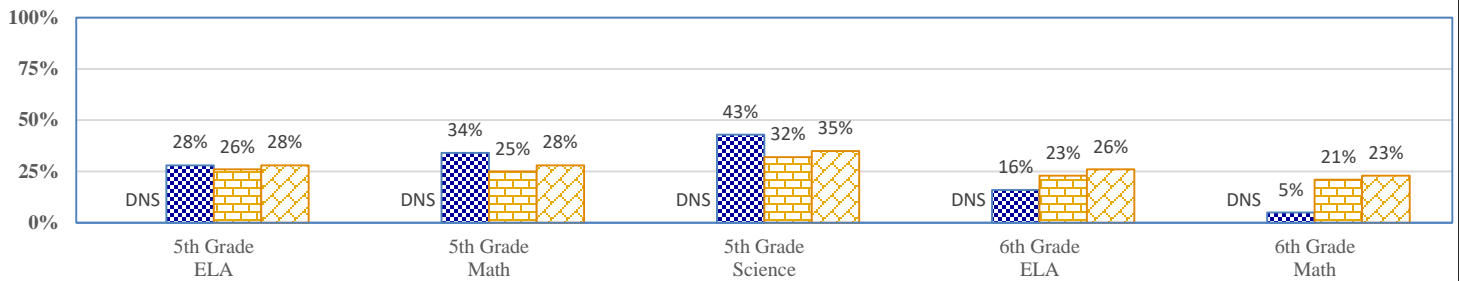
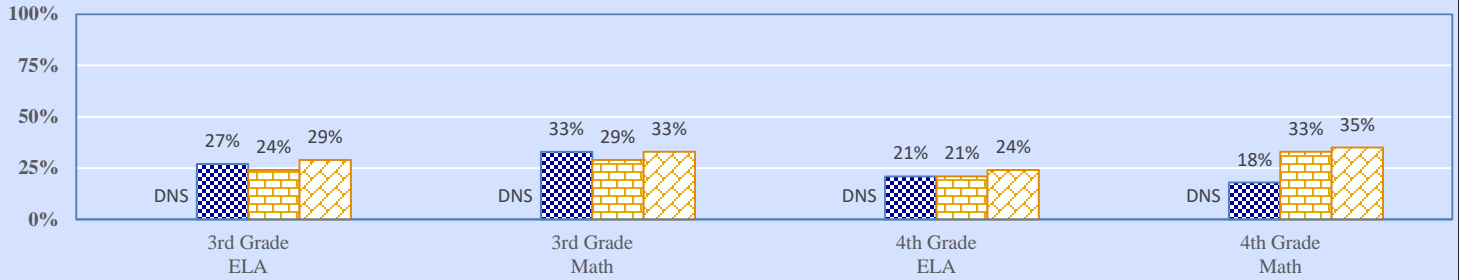
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**2022-23 Student Performance (All Students)**
